Our areas of funding are diverse—arts and culture; community development and social services; education; environment; health; mental health and disabilities; senior services; youth and families—the impact of our grants has been significant. The Fund has awarded over \$2.2M by way of 430 grants to more than 166 nonprofit organizations.

Our community's vision and support in creating and growing the fund helps local nonprofits tremendously. The Fund has grown from its initial investment of \$59,000 to over \$4 million. As government support declines, there is an increasing need for the services of our local nonprofits. Your generous contributions ensure that the Fund will continue to meet the needs of Palo Alto and its surrounding communities for generations to come.
